## DCM MEETING HELD AT KEY CLUB CONVENTION IN KONA Sheraton Keauhou Bay

Roll call was taken with East Hawaii, Honolulu, Kahului, Kaneohe, Maui, Pearl Harbor, Pearl Harbor and Valley Isle present. Lt. Tiffany welcomed all to the meeting, and asked for any member who would like to take the office of Lt. For 2010 to 2011, there were no takers, and so all officers are to go back to their clubs and ask if any past or present President who may be interested and so she continues on to explain about the Key Club realignment and called on Governor Roy Talley to explain the situation. For now, the clubs will remain the same and continue but, there is another solution to this and it is not so much a financial burden on the supporting club. This would be having their own District, with 1500+ members and 24 clubs, they will have their own Governor and possibly 3 + Lt. Governors. This will require new by laws which will take 2-3 years to process. The governor will take 1 trip to the CNH meeting and Division 22 will be called the "Hawaii District" under Kiwanis International. Then she called on Trustee Roy Kagawa who talked about the survey sent a while ago and had no response from Hawaii clubs and he encourages the clubs to

participate in this survey to help with some of the solutions that the trustees are working on. First Lady Dee asked to explain the PTP program and the new pins that is being for \$5.00 each to be put into the program to support new and inspiring Pediatric Doctors, she had a few members purchasing the pins. After her talk, Pete Edwards from the CNH Foundation talked about the "Duck Buddies", selling ducks and earn \$2.00 per duck sold, the race is on 4/19 and the money raised will also go to the PTP fund. He also mentioned that last year the Key Clubbers raised \$74,000.00 and this year they are over \$134,000.00 already and that amount does not include the jars the Key Clubbers have collected at this convention.

Club reports were reported and many interesting projects came out and the Valley Isle club will have a "Keiki Fest", a free event, with 6,000 participants and they need 300+ volunteers, wanna go and help ??? the Honolulu club was fortunate to have a past member who left \$20,000.00 for scholarship and last year there were no takers, so now it is \$40,000.00 annuity. Pearl Harbor has a new Aktion Club and they are the First. Congratulations to them. Lots of members had to leave and catch the bus to the airport, so they said adios and the meeting ended.
